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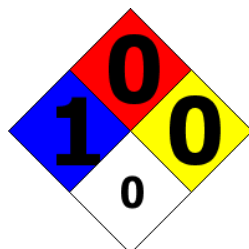

SECTION 4: First aid measures

Description of first aid measures

After inhalation: Move exposed to fresh air. Give artificial respiration if necessary. If breathing is difficult give oxygen. Loosen clothing and place exposed in a comfortable position. Seek medical assistance if cough or other symptoms appear.

After skin contact: Wash hands and exposed skin with soap and plenty of water. Seek medical attention if irritation persists or if concerned.

After eye contact: Protect unexposed eye. Flush exposed eye gently using water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contact lenses while rinsing. Keep eyelids open while rinsing. Seek medical attention.

After swallowing: Rinse mouth with water. Do not induce vomiting. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Immediately seek medical attention.

Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed:

Shortness of breath. Headache. Nausea. Dizziness. Severe skin or eye irritation, redness or burning sensation.

Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed:

Precautions for safe handling:

Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities:

Keep away from food and beverages. Protect from freezing and physical damage. Keep container tightly sealed. Store away from incompatible materials. Best if stored below 75° F (24° C). Do not store composite material in proximity of Eugenol-containing products, nor let the composite come into contact with materials containing Eugenol. Eugenol can impair the polymerization of the composite and cause discoloration.
